State Gov't participates in Water Week



STOCKHOLM, - Invited by the Water Center for Latin America and The Caribbean, the State of Mexico's Secretary of Water and Public Works and president of the National Association of Water and Sanitation Companies (ANEAS), David Korenfeld Federman, went to Stockholm, Sweden to participate in World Water Week.

World Water Week includes over 2400 participants in attendance every year. The conference features plenary sessions and panel debates, scientific workshops, poster exhibitions, side events and seminars. More than 200 organizations collaborate in the organization of events.

In a meeting with the general director of the National Water Commission (Conagua), José Luis Luege Tamargo; the director of Grupo FEMSA, Vidal Garza; and the president of the Superintendence of Health Ser-

vices of Peru, José Salazar; Korenfeld detailed the theme Action in Mexico, where he talked about public policies and works that plan out the development of hydraulics in an effort by the State of Mexico's governor Enrique Peña Nieto to ensure the state's water supply as well as increasing economic competition.

Korenfeld explained the State of Mexico is taking measures to conserve water, develop a more advanced potable water and sewage infrastructure.
